

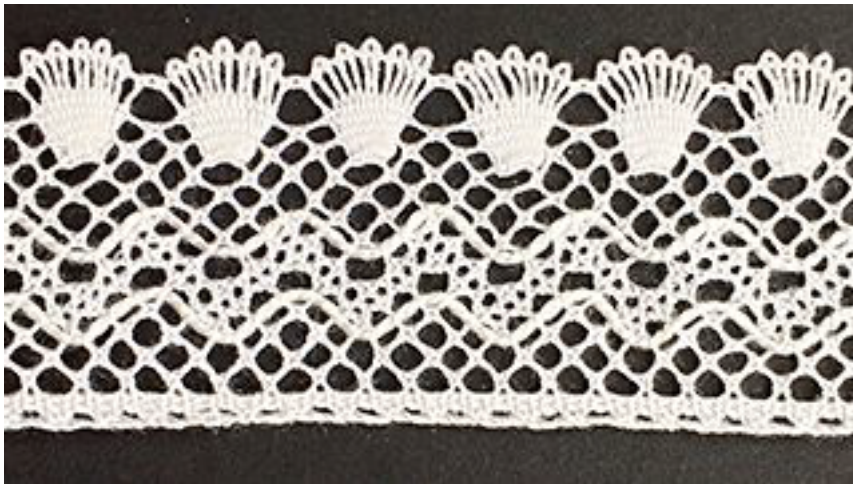

This edging is also designed by me, this time with a diagonal roseground and a French fan.

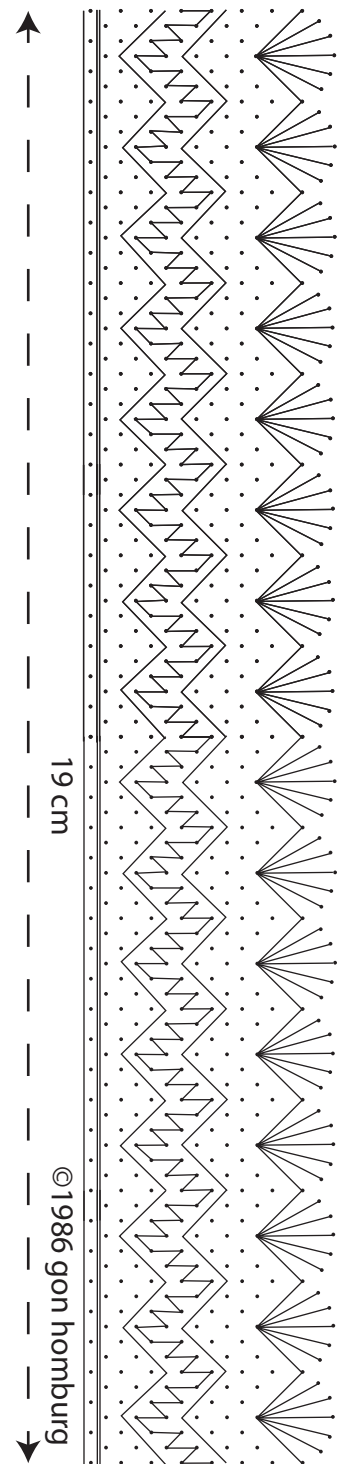
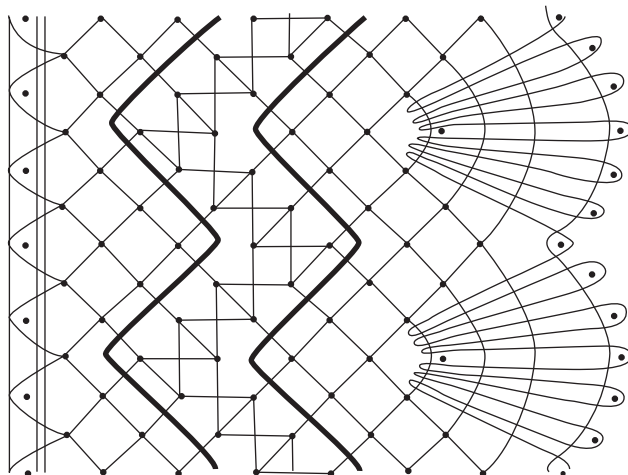
Originally it was designed as a edging for a handkerchief

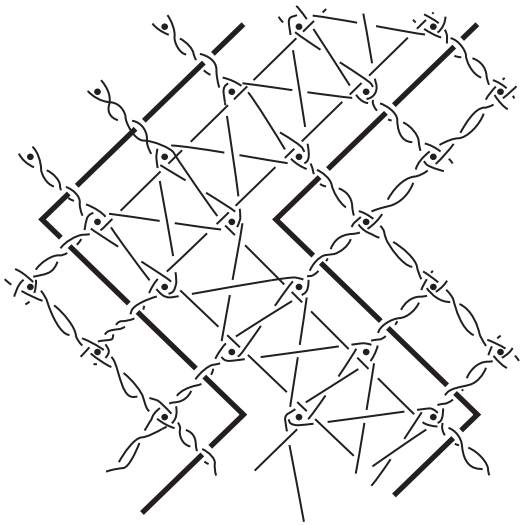
In 1986 is was already published in a booklet of the lacegroup 't Aemstelkant.

You need 18 pairs of bobbins with DMC fil a dentelle 80 or similar and 2 bobbins with a gimp ie. cotton perlé 5.



The diagram:





The diagonal roseground is made in simple torchonstitch. Make a simple torchon stitch at the corners and on the line a half stitch without a pin.

The pairs are coming from the ground through the gimp into the roseground and leave it the same way.

The French fan is made in cloth stitch with the outer pair in whole stitch. Between this pair and the last cloth stitch pair the workers should be twisted extra, in total twice. The workers are going at the inside of the fan constantly to the same point. Work with the last hanging pair on that side a turning stitch. The pin is place to the right of those two pairs. Repeat this in the next rows, replace the pin to the right of the turning stitch in the same pinhole.
